


POLICY MATTERS & APOLLO ALLIANCE PROMOTING A CLEAN ENERGY FUTURE

Existing public buildings must be retrofitted and new public buildings constructed in a high-performance way, ensuring lower energy costs and high-skill construction jobs. Key transportation investments could reduce sprawl and increase the livability of our cities, while cutting energy costs.
